RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent, at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes
2. Judges decisions are final. No person may approach a judge regarding a decision or other matters without first obtaining consent from the Steward. Anyone disregarding this rule may be asked to cancel all entries and will forfeit all entry fees.
3. The Committee reserves the right to cancel, combine, or divide the classes when deemed necessary to facilitate the smooth running of the show.
4. Courses will consist of post and rails, walls, pickets and brush.
5. Championship and reserve ribbons will be awarded in all divisions. Champion and reserve will be awarded to two of the four horses which have acquired the most points in the over fence classes in their divisions. In addition to these points, only those horses shall receive full points for ribbons won in the under-saddle classes. Points to be awarded through the first six places: 10-6-4-2-1-1/2.
6. A trophy and/or cash and ribbons will be awarded in all classes unless otherwise stated.
7. Every class offered herein which is covered by the Rules & Specifications of the current NEHC/MHC Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.
8. No numbers taken for warm-up after 7:30 a.m.
9. Prize money will be deducted from the total entry fees.
10. All classes will be judged on performance and soundness unless otherwise stated.
11. Entry Fee: \$35.00 per class unless otherwise stated. Warm up fee \$20.00, Office fee \$35.00, USEF Fee \$23.00, USHJA fee \$5.00, NEHC Fee \$2.00, MHC Fee \$1.00. Post entry fee: \$35. Returned check fee \$50.

12. Indoor Arena 80 x 200 with a well-groomed sand-based footing. Outdoor Warm-Up at least 200x 200 with sand footing. Schooling permitted in authorized areas only. Anyone found violating this rule will forfeit fees and not be allowed to show.

13. Post Entries accepted the day of the show with \$30 post entry fee. No penalty for adding additional classes the day of the show.

14. Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

15. Competition management shall piece a minimum of one sharps container per each competition, whether or not stabling is provided. Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments

16. Dogs must be leashed at all times on HBF property.

17. Exhibitors or trainers found cleaning out their trailers onto the grounds will be charged a \$50 grounds fee- NO CLEANING OUT TRAILERS, PLEASE.

18. It is compulsory for all persons at NEHC and MHC licensed hunter, jumper or hunter/jumper competitions when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured.

19. The committee reserves the right to vary or change horse show officials or judges.

Warning- Under Massachusetts law, an equine professional is not liable for an injury to, or the death of a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risk of equine activities pursuant to Chapter 12B Section 2D of the General laws.

20. All exhibitors and trainers must complete of the NEHC Waiver prior to picking up numbers.

21. No stabling available at this show

22. All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. 23. River Wind Farm will provide water and rest rooms for all show participants; however, no food is being provided at our one days shows.

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HUNTER SEAT EQUITATION

- 1. OPEN EQUITATION 17 & UNDER FLAT (USEF, NEHC C and MHC C Rated)** Walk, Trot and Canter (MHC B Rating)
- 2. OPEN EQUITATION 17 & UNDER FENCES (USEF, NEHC C and MHC C Rated)** Fences not to exceed 3' (MHC B Rating)
- 3. MHC JUNIOR HUNT SEAT MEDAL.** Open to Junior members of the MHC who have not reached their 18th birthday. All contestants are required to perform over at least 8 fences not to exceed 3'. Ten points are required to qualify for the Finals. After qualifying, contestants are able to continue to ride to help non-qualified riders qualify. One or more individual tests of the top 4 contestants may be requested at the Judges' discretion. (USEF Tests 1-19). To fill a class, at least 3 competitors must complete the course. May be combined with the MHC adult medal.
- 4. MHJ JUNIOR MEDAL.** Open to junior members who have not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1st of the current year. All contestants are required to perform over at least 6 fences not exceeding 3'. Competitors may cross enter in the NEHJ Junior Talent Medal. To fill a class, at least two competitors must complete the course. Ten points are required to qualify for the Finals. Once qualified, riders may continue to show in the class until August 1. After August 1, only those riders not qualified may compete in the classes.
- 6. MHC JUNIOR HUNT SEAT MEDAL.** Same specifications as #3
- 7. WEC PREMIER EQUITATION CUP Qualifier-** Open to all Junior members of the USEF and Equine Canada. To be shown over a minimum of eight fences 3'6" in height, spread not to exceed 4' (exception: triple bar type obstacles, maximum spread of 5'.) The course may be either a Jumper or Hunter type course and must include at least two changes of direction, a combination and two of the following: bending line, narrow jump (5'6"-8'), roll back turn, fences at end of ring, long approach to a single jump. Water obstacles (i.e.; water jump, liverpool) are not permitted. A minimum of twelve riders, if available, are required to show at a walk, trot and canter. To be judged on seat, hands, guidance and control of horse. The Under Saddle performance of those riders selected to show under saddle shall count 50%. A rider must complete both phases to be eligible for a placing. Only one rider per horse. The same horse must be used in all phases. Class to be judged in accordance with the current USEF Standards for equitation. USEF tests EQ113 permitted. Three riders must complete the course for the class to count
- 8. TAYLOR HARRIS INSURANCE SERVICES NATIONAL CHILDREN'S MEDAL ENTRY FEE: \$40**
To be shown over a minimum of 8 fences 2'9 to 3' in height, spread not to exceed fence height. The course may be either a hunter or jumper type course and must include at least 2 changes of direction and a combination. Water obstacles (i.e.: water jump Liverpool) are not permitted. The top 4 riders or 20% of the first round competitors, whichever is greater, are required to perform at least 2 individual tests. (USEF Tests 1-19). An Open Numerical Scoring System must be used in the first round, with each rider's score announced at the completion of their round.
- 9. NEHC JUNIOR HUNT SEAT MEDAL.** Open to Junior members of NEHC who have not have reached their 18th birthday. All contestants are required to perform over at least 8 fences not exceeding 3'3". One or more individual tests of the top 4 contestants may be requested at the judge's discretion. (USEF Tests 1-19). To fill a class, at least 4 competitors must complete the course. One win is required to qualify for the Finals. Once qualified, rider is no longer eligible for the preliminary class. Violation will forfeit eligibility for the Finals for that year.
- 11. USHJA 3'3" JUMPER SEAT MEDAL -** Open to Junior Active Members of USEF and USHJA who have not reached their 18th birthday. Any rider in his or her final Junior year may not compete in any classes held at a competition with a start date after August 1 of that competition year. Exception: riders in their final Junior year may compete in the USHJA 3'3" Jumping Seat Medal class held at the Marshall and Sterling/USHJA National Championships. Riders must be current Active members of USEF and USHJA prior to the start of the class. The USHJA 3'3" Jumping Seat Medal is a two phase competition with the Jumping Phase to count as 70% and the Flat Phase to count as 30% and shall be judged on the rider's equitation style, technical merit, judgment and execution of an efficient, time saving pace and track. The Jumping phase of the class shall be held prior to the Flat phase over a Jumper style course with a minimum of ten numbered fences at the respective height and spread. Course must include a dry Liverpool.
- 12. DOVER SADDLERY/USEF HUNTER SEAT MEDAL - ENTRY FEE: \$50**
Open to junior members of USA Equestrian who have not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1st of the current year. To be shown over a course of not less than 8 obstacles at 3'6" which must include 1 combination including an over and 2 changes of direction (change of lead) after the first obstacle. To fill a class, 3 competitors must complete the course.
- 13. NHSAA/ASPCA HORSEMANSHIP. ENTRY FEE: \$50**
Open to the junior members of ASPCA who have not reached their 18th birthday. Must show their ASPCA number on the entry blank. To be shown over at least 8 fences not exceeding 3'6". The under-saddle performance of those riders selected to show under saddle shall count 50%. To fill a class, 6 competitors must complete the course.
- 14. USEF/NCEA JUNIOR Hunt Seat Medal -** Open to all Junior members of USEF (must be NCEA member to collect points). Judging based on combined performance over two phases, fences and flat. Competitors must use the same horse in both phases. To be shown over a minimum of eight fences 3' 3" in height, spread not to exceed fence height. The course may be either a Jumper or Hunter type course and must include at least two changes of

direction and a combination. Water obstacles and liverpools are not permitted. An open numerical scoring system must be used in the first phase, with each rider's score announced at the completion of their round. Flat Phase: The top 10 will be asked to return to the arena for a flat phase performing at a walk, trot and canter. From USEF Tests 1-19. In addition, riders are required to perform 2 of 3 basic dressage movements of a shoulder-in, haunches-in or leg yield both directions of the ring at the discretion of the judge. The Under Saddle performance of those riders selected to participate in this phase shall count 50% of the overall two-phase performance. There is no minimum requirement to fill the class. Riders who do not return for the flat phase are not eligible for a ribbon.

48. NHS 3'3" Equitation Championship. (3) – ENTRY FEE \$45 -Open only to junior members of the USEF or Equine Canada who have never competed in any of the following National Equitation Finals with fences at 3'6": ASPCA Maclay Finals, US Medal Finals, USEF Talent Search (East or West), WIHS Equitation Classic Finals, Jump Canada Medal Finals or the North American Equitation Championship. Riders may not show in both the ASPCA Maclay Finals and the National Horse Show 3'3" Equitation Championship in the same competition year. To be shown over a course of not less than eight obstacles.

49. IHSA/USHJA 3'3" Hunter Seat Medal (3) – ENTRY FEE \$45. This medal is open to Junior Active Members of the Federation and USHJA who have not competed in any of the following Equitation Finals with fences at 3'6" within the same competition year (Medal/Maclay, Talent Search, WIHS). To be shown over no less than 8 obstacles with heights of 3'3" and spreads to 3'6".

AMATEUR ADULT EQUITATION

15. AMATEUR ADULT EQUITATION FLAT (USEF, NEHC C rated and MHC C rated). Open to riders 18 years and over. Walk, trot and Canter.

16. AMATEUR ADULT EQUITATION FENCES (USEF, NEHC C rated and MHC C Rated) Eight fences 2'6"-2'9"

17. MHC ADULT HUNT SEAT MEDAL. Open to adult members of MHC. All contestants are required to perform over at least 8 fences 2'6" to 2'9", with at least 1 change of direction. One or more individual tests of the top 4 contestants may be requested at the judge's discretion. (USEF Test 1-19). To fill a class at least 3 competitors must complete the course. After qualifying, contestants are able to continue to ride to help non-qualified riders qualify. May be combined with MHC Junior Medal.

18. MHJ ADULT MEDAL. Open to all Amateur Adult competitors to perform over at least 8 fences 2'9" to 3'0", spreads not to exceed fence height, with at least 2 changes of direction and a combination. At the finals, class will be divided 18-30 and over 30. At least 2 riders must complete the course in order for points to count. To qualify: 10 points. Once qualified, riders may continue to show in the class until August 1, 2020. After August 1, 2020 only those riders not qualified may compete in the class. See complete specs and point system in the horse show office.

20. MHC ADULT/AMATEUR HUNT SEAT MEDAL. Same specs as class 17.

21. NEHC ADULT AMATEUR HUNT SEAT MEDAL. Open to adult amateur members of NEHC. All contestants are required to perform over at least 8 fences not to exceed 3'0". One or more individual tests of the top 4 contestants may be requested at the discretion of the Judge. (USEF Tests 1-17). To fill a class at least 3 contestants must complete the course. Once a contestant has qualified they are no longer eligible for the preliminary classes. Violation will forfeit eligibility for the finals for that year. Ten points to qualify for finals (10,6,4,2,1,1/2)

22. ARIAT NATIONAL ADULT MEDAL ENTRY FEE: \$40 To be shown over a minimum of 8 fences not to exceed 3" in height, spread not to exceed fence height. The course may be either a Jumper or Hunter type course and must include at least 2 changes of direction and a combination. Water obstacle (i.e.: water jump, Liverpool) are not permitted. The top 4 riders, or 20% of the first-round competitors, whichever is greater, are required to perform at least 2 individual tests. (USEF Tests 1-19). An Open Numerical Scoring System must be used in the first round, with each rider's score announced at the completion of their round. At least 6 ribbons shall be awarded in each qualifying class.

50. THIS/NHS ADULT EQUITATION CHAMPIONSHIP (3) ENTRY FEE \$45 Open to senior members of USEF who have reached their 18th birthday. Rider and trainer must be members of NHS. To be shown over a course of not less than 8 obstacles at 3' (3'3"-3'6" spread). To be judged on seat, hands, guidance and control of the horse.

24. MHJ Adult Mini Medal -Open to Amateur Adults who have not shown over a course where the fences exceed 3' in the current year. To perform over at least 6 fences not to exceed 2'6". Riders may not cross enter into the MHJ Adult Medal or the NEHJ Adult Talent Medal. At least 2 riders must complete the course. Once qualified, riders may continue to show in the class until August 1, 2020. After August 1, 2020 only those riders not qualified may compete in the class. See complete specs and point system in the horse show office.

42. MHJ MINI MEDAL. Open to all junior riders who have not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1, with the exception of maiden and novice riders who have not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1. To perform over at least 8 fences not to exceed 2'6". Competitors may cross enter into the MHJ Children's Medal Horse or Pony class at the Finals. To fill a class, at least two competitors must complete the course. Ten points are required to qualify for the Finals. Once qualified, riders may continue to show in the class until August 1, 2020. After August 1, 2020 only those riders not qualified may compete in the Class.

41 and 44. MHC HUNT SEAT MINI MEDAL-Open to members of MHC who have not reached their 15th birthday as of December 1st of the current year and have not competed in classes in which the entry is required to jump higher than 2'9". All contestants are to compete over a course not exceeding 8 fences and not less than 6 fences, excluding combination fences, at a height not to exceed 2'6". One or more individual tests may be requested at the Judge's discretion. (USEF Tests 1-5). To fill a class, a least 3 competitors must complete the course. Ten points to qualify for the Finals. After qualifying, contestants are able to continue to ride to help non-qualified riders qualify. May be combined with MHC Adult Mini-Medal.

45. MHJ CHILDREN'S MEDAL- Open to all junior riders who have not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1, and who have not shown over a course where the fences have exceeded 3'. To be shown over a minimum of 8 fences the required height, including a combination and at least two changes of direction after the first fence. The same horse must be used in all phases. Small/med ponies to jump 2' and large ponies/horses to jump 2'6". Only one rider per horse. Competitors may not cross enter into the MHJ Mini Medal or NEHJ Junior Talent Medal at the Finals. To fill a class, at least two competitors must complete the course. Ten points are required to qualify for the Finals. Once qualified riders may continue to show in the class until August 1, 2020. After August 1, 2020, only those riders not qualified may compete in the class.

HUNTER DIVISIONS

3'3" JUNIOR HUNTERS (12/6, 4/18 and 11/14 shows only)

USEF "B", NEHC "B" Rated, MHC "A" Rated - DIVISION FEE \$100 or \$35 PER CLASS

Open to horses of any age. Fences height 3'3"-3'6" (depending on division). All classes to be judged on performance and soundness with an emphasis on manners. Extreme speed penalized. Trophy & Eight Ribbons

67. JUNIOR HUNTER HORSE 3'3"

68. JUNIOR HUNTER HORSE STAKE 3'3" - \$30/\$22/\$15/\$13/\$10/\$10

69. JUNIOR HUNTER HORSE 3'3" under Saddle

LOW CHILDREN'S HUNTERS

USEF Rated - Open to exhibitors who have not yet reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year. Riders may not cross enter at the same competition into the Children's Hunter, Pony Hunter or any class/section where fences exceed 2'9". The Low Children's Hunter and Low Adult Amateur Hunter sections may be combined if there are fewer than three (3) entries in either section. To be shown over 8 fences at 2'6".

104. Low Children's Hunter O/F A

105. Low Children's Hunter O/F B

106. Low Children's Hunter under Saddle

LOW ADULT HUNTERS

USEF Rated, NEHC C rated. Open to exhibitors who have reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year. Riders may not cross enter into any class or section at the same competition where fences exceed 2'9". 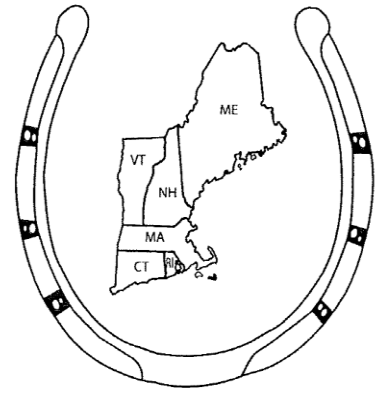
